Literacy Overview of Activities to Support Learning at Home

Primary 1D

The table below includes a variety of make, create, explore and investigate activities that your child can complete to support their Literacy knowledge, skills and development.

<p>Create your own story character – they can be anything you want! Make sure to give your character a name and draw a detailed picture of them.</p>	<p>Write a narrative story about a character you like (or it can be one you have created). Remember to have a beginning, middle and end in your writing.</p>	<p>Read a book or watch a programme/movie you haven't read/seen before. Stop it halfway through and make a prediction of what you think will happen next. Write it down then watch the rest to see if you are correct!</p>	<p>Read a book or watch a programme/movie. 'Have a go' writing three sentences to summarise what happened during it.</p>
<p>Read a book or watch a programme/movie. Draw a picture of your favourite part and explain why you like it in a sentence or two.</p>	<p>Explore rhyming word families e.g. '-at', '-ip' '-ag' etc. Write a list of words that rhyme and try to write some silly sentences to make you laugh. 'A fat cat sat on a mat'.</p>	<p>Play Hangman with an adult using words from your Spelling or Word Wallet.</p>	<p>Write a recount about something you have enjoyed doing during Primary 1. Remember to include your feelings as well as grammar such as capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.</p>
<p>Access Oxford Owls website and choose a book to read with an adult. Create questions to ask each other about the text.</p>	<p>Access Oxford Owls website and choose a book. Read a text and write a review on it including what you liked and a score out of 5.</p>	<p>Draw pictures of different objects which feature your joined phoneme e.g. <u>book</u> for 'oo'. Have a go at writing what each one is underneath.</p>	<p>Rainbow write your common words using your Spelling Wallet. Have a go at writing spelling sentences for three (or more) of these.</p>
<p>Watch 'Geraldine Giraffe' with your new joined phoneme on YouTube. Draw pictures of what Geraldine finds and have a go writing a sentence about each one.</p>	<p>Have a look around your house to find objects featuring your joined phoneme and write a list of these words i.e. <u>book</u>, <u>food</u>, etc.</p>	<p>Bake or cook with an adult. Have a go at writing the ingredients as a list, or write simple instructions for how you made it.</p>	<p>Play a card game, board game or written game e.g. Stop the Bus. You can change the headings to make it simpler or more challenging.</p>
