Literacy Overview of Activities to Support Learning at Home Primary 4



The table below includes a variety of make, create, explore and investigate activities that your child can complete to support their Literacy knowledge, skills and development.

Write a set of instructions for growing or looking after a plant or an animal of your choice.	Write your own story set in either a castle or in a forest. Remember who, where, when, what and why?	Act out your story with a friend or family member and perform it to your family. Ask someone to take a photo of you acting in the play.	Learn and sing a song about Easter time and then re-write the words in a different genre. e.g. A rap.
Use Lego or junk modelling to build your own castle. Can you create a whole village? What essential resources would the people that live there need?	Write a newspaper report about an event that has happened around the world. You may want to write about how the community pulled together to help each other.	Prepare a presentation about an animal that you like. Include details about where it lives, food, habitat etc.	Make a bird seed cake to hang outside this winter. Include your recipe and which types of birds will eat your cake.
Go on a walk and make a record of the different sounds you can hear. Can you think of any instruments that make similar sounds to those you heard?	Listen to a piece of classical music and draw a picture of what you think it is about or what it makes you think of.	Read your book with an adult. Make a <i>prediction</i> about what will happen next.	Read a book, magazine or comic for enjoyment.
Draw a scene from any of your reading books and label it with key words about character, setting, plot.	Create at least 5 interview questions for a member of your family about their school life. Interview them and log their answers.	Can you create 10 true, false and can't tell statements about a book you have read?	***** this is a box of free choice ***** Create an activity of your own and report back to class what you did.
