Literacy Overview of Activities to Support Learning at Home Class 1

The table below includes a variety of make, create, explore and investigate activities that your child can complete to support their Literacy knowledge, skills and development.

<p>Choose a book to read with an adult. Can you point to the title, author and blurb?</p> <p>Can you make up some questions to ask an adult about the story?</p>	<p>Have a go at writing a sentence to say what you have done today.</p> <p>Remember capital letters, a full stop and finger spaces. Now draw a picture.</p>	<p>Have a go at writing your name. Try this each day and see how much you improve.</p> <p>Remember to use 'nippy fingers'.</p>	<p>Retell your favourite traditional tale (eg 3 Little Pigs, Gingerbread man, Goldilocks) to an adult at home. Can you act it out?</p>
<p>Read a book or watch a programme/movie you haven't read/seen before. Stop it halfway through and make a prediction of what you think will happen next. Write it down then watch the rest to see if you are correct!</p>	<p>Find 3 words that rhyme with each of these words-</p> <p>cat pen rug log bun</p>	<p>How many CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words can you think of.</p> <p>E.g. cat, dog, jam, pen etc.</p> <p>Write them down.</p>	<p>Can you practise reading and writing the common words on the list below? You could even make some flashcards.</p>
<p>Find a newspaper, magazine or leaflet. Can you cut out letters to spell some words?</p>	<p>Have a go at the 'first words' spelling game on Doorway Online.</p> <p>www.doorwayonline.org.uk</p>	<p>Listen to Jolly Phonics songs on Youtube. Can you sing your favourite song to an adult?</p>	<p>Practise writing all of your initial sounds with different materials e.g. pens, paint, crayons etc. Use Doorway Online to help you with formation.</p>
<p>Pick a sound, write it in the middle of a page. How many words can you think of that begin with that sound? Draw a picture of the things that you have thought of around your letter.</p>	<p>Make up a story and tell it to an adult. Remember your story should have a beginning, a middle and an end.</p>	<p>Play a game of I spy with an adult.</p>	<p>Practise saying some nursery rhymes. Can you tell your favourite one to a brother, sister or adult?</p>
