Literacy Overview of Activities to Support Learning at Home

Class 3

The table below includes a variety of make, create, explore and investigate activities that your child can complete to support their Literacy knowledge, skills and development.

Cut letters from a newspaper or magazine to make silly sentences	Watch a movie and write a review about it.	Keep a diary for 5 days. Write about what happens, things you do and how you are feeling. Draw your favourite scene from a book you have enjoyed reading. Try and see if your family can guess the book!	Use these words to write a story: creepy, house, ghost, cob web and shadows.
Watch the Newsround. Write about a story that interests you.	Create an informative poster about your favourite game or animal.	Read a book or watch a movie you haven't read/seen before. Stop it halfway through and make a prediction of what will happen next. See if your prediction is correct!	Research information about something you are interested in. Present your findings to your family.
Keep a diary for 5 days. Write about what happens, things you do and how you are feeling.	Create a wordsearch or crossword for someone in your family.	Practise your spelling by visiting the following website. http://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/lcwc/index.html	Help an adult with baking. Write out the ingredients and the recipe.
Make up a story and tell it to an adult. Remember your story should have a beginning, a middle and an end.	Use adjectives to describe something in your house or in the garden. See if someone can guess the object.	Choose a book to read with an adult. Can you point to the title, author and blurb? Can you make up some questions to ask an adult about the story?	Can you write out instructions for a family member or friend to follow.
