

## Primary 3 Spelling Home Learning Tasks

You must write your words three times in your homework jotter using SACAWAC. You can then choose as many different tasks as you wish to practise your spelling at home. One example of a task you have completed must be handed in each week to your class teacher. You should try to do a variety of activities each week.

<b>Snap!</b> Make two copies of your words. Play Snap with them.	<b>Squiggly Writing</b> Write your words in squiggly writing.	<b>Consonant Words</b> Write your spelling words with the consonants in a different colour.	<b>Hangman</b> Play Hangman with a parent or carer using your spelling words.	<b>Reverse Alphabetical Order</b> Write your words in reverse alphabetical order e.g. from Z to A
<b>Pyramid Spelling</b> Write your spelling words in a pyramid shape e.g. F Fu Fun Funn Funny	<b>Other handed words</b> If you are right handed, write your words with your left hand and vice versa.	<b>Cheerleading Words</b> Make a cheer for some of your spelling words. Share it with the class.	<b>Syllable Words</b> Work out how many syllables each of your words have. Clap the syllables of your words.	<b>Scrambled Words</b> Ask an adult to scramble each of the letters in your words. Try to unscramble the words.
<b>Find the Words</b> Choose a spelling word. Use the letters in your spelling word to make as many new words as you can.	<b>Forwards / Backwards</b> Write each word forwards then backwards.	<b>Chant</b> Chant your spelling words to a parent or carer	<b>Short Story Words</b> Write a short story using your spelling words. Can you use them all? Underline your spelling words.	<b>Speedy Spell</b> Set a timer for 30 seconds, how many times can you write one of your spelling words?
<b>Silly Sentences</b> Write a silly sentence for 5 of your spelling words. Underline your spelling word in each sentence.	<b>Sentences</b> Write a sentence for 5 of your spelling words. Underline your spelling word in each sentence.	<b>Practice Test</b> Ask a parent or carer to do a mock spelling test with you.	<b>Spelling City</b> Use Spelling City to practise your spelling.
