Primary 5 Class Charter

The Class Charter is created to help children understand their rights in relation to the Articles in The UN Rights of the Child, to understand how important it is to have rights and to develop their own sense of responsibilities.



Social Studies Topic

In Social Studies we have been focusing on the book 'Have You Filled a Bucket Today?'. The book uses an invisible bucket, that everyone has, to help illustrate how to fill your bucket through daily kindness appreciation. It also explores feelings and how we feel when our bucket is full. We have been making our own buckets in class.





Maths

In Numeracy, we will be working on improving our instant recall skills for multiplication and division processes through daily practice in class. Children will be undertaking a variety of Maths activities to develop their skills in accordance to their ability groupings. These will include place value, shape, time, volume and money.

Literacy

In Literacy this term we will have a focus on poetry and narrative in writing. As part of our poetry topic, the children will be learning about Scots language and using it in their writing. In reading children will use our class library to read a variety of genres during personal reading. We will also be focussing on spelling this session and revising our spelling activities and skills from last year.



Health and Wellbeing

The boys and girls have been en joying our weekly PAThS lessons. In PAThS the children learn about emotions, how they impact our behaviour and the different choices we have when dealing with them.
