Explain why the story has the title it's been given? How did the main character feel at the beginning/end of the story? Which part of the story do you like best? Why? Did anyone in the book do something you did not like? Why? From whose point of view is the story written? Make a cartoon strip showing the sequence of events 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Can you list the places in the book that are important? Choose a character from the book you have just read. Write a set of questions that a person could use to interview this character. Paint a familiar scene from the story What lesson did you learn from the story? Have you had a similar experience to the main character? Can you write a letter to a friend recommending the book? Can you think of another story character who is similar to the one in the book? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Design a new front cover for the book you have read. Make it visually appealing so it will attract readers. Refer to other book covers to see what to include. Compare two characters from the book. In what ways are they the same? In what ways are they different? What is the relationship between the main characters? Can you write a different ending to the book? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Make a bookmark for the book you have read and write your evaluation of the book on it. Place the bookmark in your chosen book so others can read it before choosing the book. Was the main character a good or bad person? Why? What changes would you make to turn the bad guy into the hero? Which parts of the story do you think could be better? Do you agree with the actions of the main character? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Invent a machine to do a specific task from the story. Design a CD, book or magazine cover for the story. What would this character do if...? What did you think was the most interesting part of the book? Why? Who do you think the author intended this book for and why? Which character would you choose for a friend? Why?

Write 2 words from the glossary and their definitions. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Make a word search using key words and facts from the text. Write a set of true /false questions about the text. Try out your questions on a friend. Name two/ three things that you learned from the book. What new word did you learn and what does it mean? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Locate 3 - 5 words you found difficult to read or understand. Use a dictionary to find the meaning of these words. Write the words and their meanings. Make one of the following relating to your book so others could learn while they are using them; <i>a cartoon, pop-up book, mural, poster collage, puppets, maps or a wanted poster.</i> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> What fact(s) did you find most interesting? What does the book remind you of? Did the text make you change your mind about the topic? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Give your book a rank or rating.
